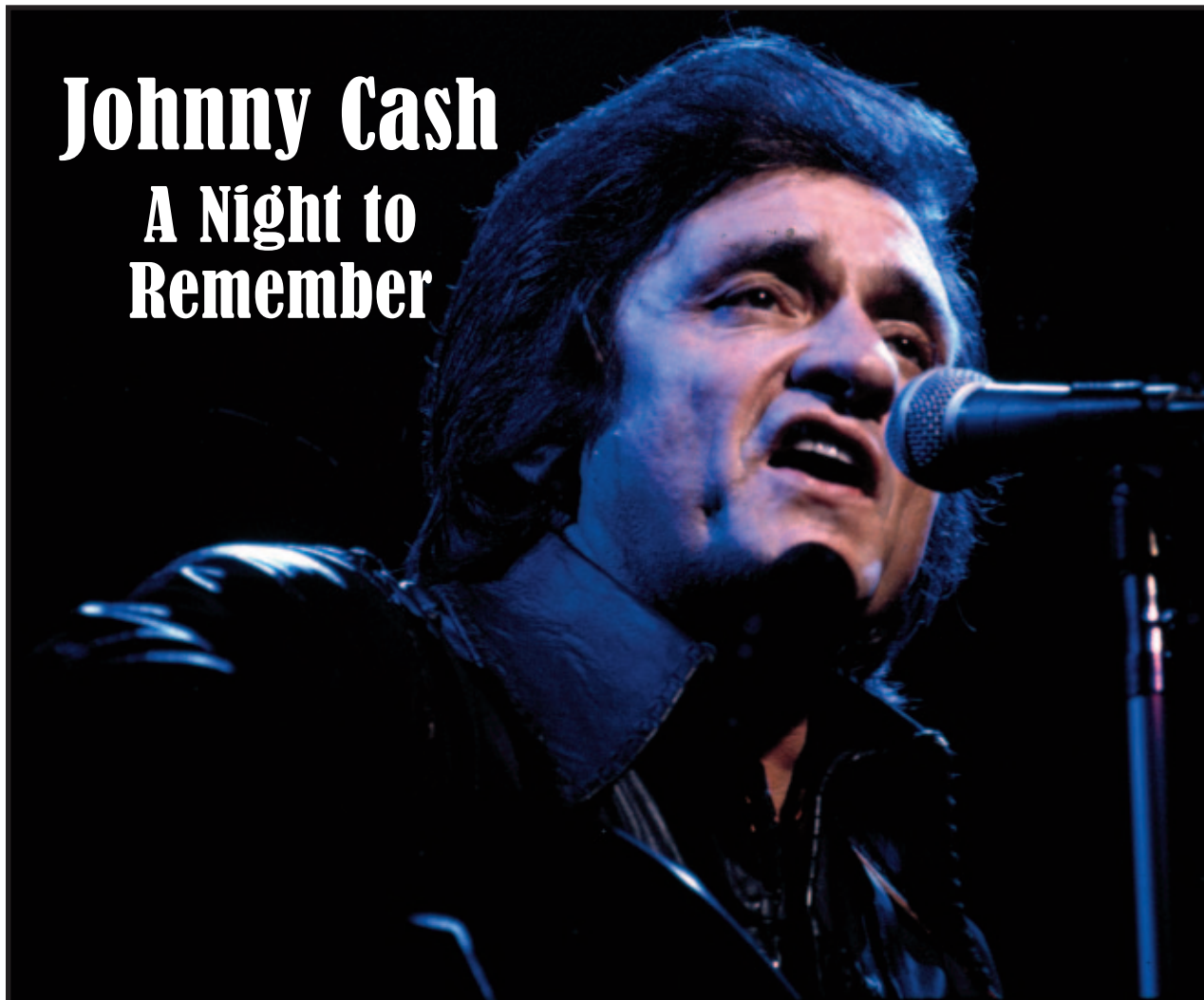

American Experience “The Blinding of Isaac Woodard”

Tuesday, March 30 at 8pm

In 1946, Isaac Woodard, a Black army sergeant on his way home to South Carolina after serving in WWII, was taken off a Greyhound bus after a heated exchange with the driver, who refused to let him off at a rest stop to use the restroom. The local chief of police savagely beat him, leaving him unconscious and permanently blind. The shocking incident made national headlines and, when the police chief was acquitted by an all-white jury, the injustice would change the course of American history. The program details how the crime led to the racial awakening of South Carolina Judge J. Waties Waring and President Harry Truman, who desegregated the military and federal offices two years later. It also set the stage for the Supreme Court’s landmark 1954 Brown v. Board of Education decision, which finally outlawed segregation in public schools and jumpstarted the modern civil rights movement.

As I’m writing this, its mid February and we’re in the midst of a very nasty cold spell that just doesn’t want to end. This morning it was -39 F at our house north of Bemidji. This is definitely the time of the year when it’s perfect to curl up on the couch and watch your favorite programs on Lakeland PBS!

This month we’ll be showcasing some great new programming as we begin our March pledge drive. Check out this edition of Highlights to see all the special programs we have in store for you. Our March pledge drive is our biggest on-air fundraiser of the year.

Every March we have a large number of our supporters whose annual support ends this month. This method of supporting Lakeland PBS is best because we don’t have to send annual renewal notices through the mail, so it save us time, printing, and postage costs. You probably aren’t aware, but for annual contributors, on average, it takes three separate renewal reminder mail pieces to get people to notice and actually response. This takes away valuable resources that could be better invested in the programs you enjoy, so please consider becoming a sustaining member. When you do become a sustaining member, please know that you can change your pledge amount or stop your contribution at any time just by emailing or calling us. I also want to take a minute to talk about Passport. Passport is an online streaming video-on-demand (VOD) service that is available to any Lakeland PBS member that contributes \$60 or more annually. With Passport, you can enjoy more of what you already love about the programs you watch on Lakeland PBS. The advantage of watching with Passport is that you have access to a huge library of great PBS programs that you can watch on your schedule. In addition, when many new series debut on Lakeland PBS’ broadcast channel, many of these new series release all the episodes at once on Passport, so you can binge watch the entire season in many cases. A few months back I mentioned that Lakeland PBS had several staff retirements coming this year. I’m both excited and sad to say that I’m one of them who will be retiring. Our board of directors is currently conducting a search for our next CEO and we hope to fill the position early this summer. Once we do, I will be stepping down and retiring. I have served as CEO for over 20 years and have been with Lakeland PBS since July of 1985. I’m excited for the organization to get some “new blood” in the CEO role and to see where the next leader takes the organization going forward. We have an excellent board who care deeply about the mission of Lakeland PBS and I’m confident that under their guidance, the next CEO can and will keep the organization focused on serving the region.

Over the 35+ years that I’ve worked at Lakeland PBS, I have been involved in great deal of change. Back when I started in 1985, I was hired as Director of Engineering. Our sole office and studio was located on the campus of Bemidji State University and we had no station in central Minnesota. We operated just one channel, KAWB Channel 9. During my first year we started a campaign to raise funds and plan for a new station to serve central Minnesota. It was my job to design and build our central Minnesota station and I was excited about the opportunity and challenge! KAWB channel 22 went on the air in 1987. When our central Minnesota transmitter site was built, we also included a small office at the remote site located 6 miles north of Pillager. We included the capability of going live from this location and brought in community members to do live pledge breaks from “ice station zebra” on top of a steep hill in the Pillsbury State forest. Getting to the site proved to be a challenge in the winter and certainly wasn’t convenient or accessible to the public or our staff. To address this issue, we built a small office and studio in the northwest corner of the Ace Hardware building on Washington Street in Brainerd and are still at that location today. Adding a second station and local news and more local programming, we quickly outgrew our space at BSU, so our next big challenge was acquire a new headquarters in Bemidji that would meet our growing needs. It was a huge task to fundraise for, design, and build the 18,000 square foot facility we now call home. We did it on time and under budget and moved from BSU to the new facility in April of 2015.

Over the years, I have learned that people are what make an organization successful. The highlight of my career has been working with so many dedicated, hard-working members of our team who have become like family to me. The average tenure of our management team is well over 20 years and the dedication of all of our board and staff to our mission to educate, entertain, enrich, and enlighten is what has made Lakeland PBS not only successful, but a great place to spend a career!

The world is in turmoil and Americans are the unhappiest they've been in 50 years. With millions sickened from COVID-19 and more than 300, 000 Americans dead in a global pandemic that brought social isolation, grief, fear, and an economy in tatters mixed with anti-racism protests after the killing of George Floyd and the ongoing political divide, we've been brought to our emotional knees. As a nation, we're feeling so stressed and unhappy, it sparked a spike in the number of new prescriptions for antidepressants, anti-anxiety medications and sleep aids during and after the pandemic. Depression, the opposite of being happy, tripled in just few months in early 2020, from 8.5%, which was already up from the prior decade, to a horrifying 27.8%.

In this program, psychiatrist Dr. Daniel Amen and his wife Tana Amen, an ICU nurse will show you how to dragons that cause these problems to help you feel happier, more positive and more in control of your own emotions.
