Lesson Plan: Mongolian Culture Research

Grade Level: 8

Subject: Writing/History/Media Literacy

Time: 5-40 min. sessions

Standards:

Objective:

Students will be able to show understanding of the characteristics of nomadic life of the Mongolian people by researching and writing an expository essay.

Materials: Computers, notebooks, pencils

Procedure:

Day 1:

- 1. Show students a map with western Mongolia. Ask students to predict the climate of that region on the map.
- 2. Show students the following video, "Wool Yurt Mural Part 1" https://video.lptv.org/video/wool-yurt-mural-part-1-3jhufx/
- 3. Discuss what they saw in the video. ("What did you find interesting?", What would you like/dislike about living in that community of nomadic people?", etc.) Have students turn and talk with a neighbor and write down at least 5 questions that they have after watching the video.

Day 2:

Using at least three of the questions, students will start to plan their essay by researching and taking notes. (There is a 5-paragraph Essay Outline attached)

Day 3:

Students will spend the class period today writing their rough draft using their notes from their plan that they completed on day 2.

Day 4:

Have students trade their rough drafts with a partner and as they peer revise, students will go through the revision checklist attached.

Day 5:

After editing rough drafts, students will type up their essays.

Follow-up Discussion:

What is something that you learned? Do you have any new questions after researching?
